Illustration: The desire to know the future

JESUS - THE TRUE AUTHOR

While John the Apostle was the human author of Revelation, the truth is that in this case he was merely taking dictation from the true author: Jesus Christ (1:1).

John provides a description of Jesus in this opening chapter:

• "The faithful witness" (John 14:6, John 18:37)

• "The firstborn of the dead"

• "The ruler of kings on earth"

• "One like the son of man"

• Jesus' physical appearance (v.12-16)
SETTING • Why was John on Patmos? (v.9)
