


Part VIII: Message to Philadelphia - Opportunity

THE CHURCHES OF ASIA



BACKGROUND: CITY OF PHILADELPHIA

- The city of Philadelphia was about 28 miles southeast of Sardis, as you can see on your map. Like Sardis, it was situated in some fairly fertile land. The city sat on the banks of a small river, Cogamus, which was not a particularly important river. Its agricultural focus was vineyards and wine production.
- It is not as old as some of the other cities in these messages, being founded around 189 BC by the ruler of Pergamum, and the city was given its name based on the nickname of that ruler. The purpose for the city was that it would be the center for the spread of Greek culture throughout the region.

- Like Sardis, it was heavily damaged in the massive earthquake of AD 14, and again like Sardis, it was rebuilt through the generosity of the Roman emperor Tiberius, who had granted the city disaster aid. This region was particularly susceptible to both earthquakes and volcanic activity, which led to many of its residents living in fear of when the next "big one" would come. Indeed, the city has been destroyed by earthquakes on several occasions over the years.
- Also like Sardis, it was strategically located at the junction of trade routes. This made the city commercially important to the founders of the city. Being built on the slopes of the Tmolus mountains, it was also easily defensible.
- Today, the city is known as Allahshehr, or "the city of God," in modern day Turkey.

- - The Philadelphians were, like the believers in the other cities, facing persecution. Like the Smyrnans, much of it was coming from the Jews in the city (the "synagogue of Satan").
 - When we face severe opposition, like these early believers endured, what is our natural reaction? Is this what Christ had in mind?

CONDEMNATION

• Is there any condemnation for the church at Philadelphia?

CORRECTION

Though there is no condemnation, Christ does offer a preventative correction.

- "Hold fast what you have, so that no one may your "(v. 11).

CONSEQUENCE

Again, because there is no condemnation, there is no consequence for continuing in the sinful actions.
